

Donor wall unveiled at Wright Memorial Hospital

At Wright Memorial Hospital Friday evening, the Hospital Foundation's Donor Recognition Wall was unveiled. It is nine feet, six inches wide by four feet, six inches tall. The base is laminate with engraved copy and graphics filled black and tan, with smoke laminate trim.

Nameplates are divided into categories of Visionaries, Humanitarians, and Benefactors. They are made of metal laminate. The Patrons and Friends levels are displayed on a 13 inches wide by 29 inches tall clear film sheet. The donor recognition wall features the ability to add individuals and businesses well into the future, and also move them from one level to another.

Wright Charitable Trust as a Visionary of the Foundation. To be recognized as a Visionary, one must contribute \$500,000 or more.

Ostertuhn said the more names that get added to the donor recognition wall, the stronger the

hospital and community become.
